

Overview of School History

National Tainan Chia Chi Senior High School was established on April 1, 1924, during the Japanese colonial period (Taisho 13). Initially, it functioned as a one-year Women's Special Training Department affiliated with Tainan Commercial Supplementary School. Three years later, it transitioned to a three-year program.



In April 1933, the school became independent as the "Tainan Women's Vocational School." In May of the following year, it relocated to its new campus on Jingxue Street. Over the years, the school underwent several name changes:

- 1937: Renamed "Tainan Practical Women's School."
- 1941: Renamed "Tainan Home Economics Women's School."
- April 1944: Renamed "Tainan Commercial Practical Women's School."

On December 17, 1945, Mr. Lin Zhang-Da was appointed to take over the school, and in February of the following year, it was renamed "Tainan City Junior Commercial Vocational School for Girls."

In August 1952, the school began trial operations for family studies at both junior and senior levels. By 1954, it was formally renamed "Tainan City Household Vocational School."

In September 1956, the school started handling general junior high school affairs. By August 1957, it temporarily administered "Tainan Girls' High School," which was officially established on November 1 of the same year, taking over the junior high school responsibilities.

On August 1, 1962, the school was restructured as "Taiwan Provincial Tainan Household Vocational School." By July 1970, the junior division was phased out, and it was renamed "Taiwan Provincial Tainan Senior Household Vocational School." In August 1972, it became "Taiwan Provincial Tainan Chia Chi Girls' Senior High School" while continuing to offer home economics courses.

Significant developments include:

- 1980: The establishment of an Evening Household Vocational School.
- 1990: The introduction of a gifted education program in dance.

- February 2000: Following government administrative adjustments, it was renamed "National Tainan Chia Chi Girls' Senior High School."

In the 2014 academic year, under the 12-year National Basic Education Reform, the school expanded admission channels. By 2016, it began admitting 80 male students annually to the general program, while removing gender restrictions from vocational programs. **On August 1, 2016, it was renamed "National Tainan Chia Chi Senior High School" to reflect the current academic environment.**

Other milestones:

- 2019: Ceased operations of the Evening Household Vocational School.
- 2020: Adjusted admission quotas, increasing male student intake in the general program to 105 students due to changes in the admission exam system for the Tainan area.
